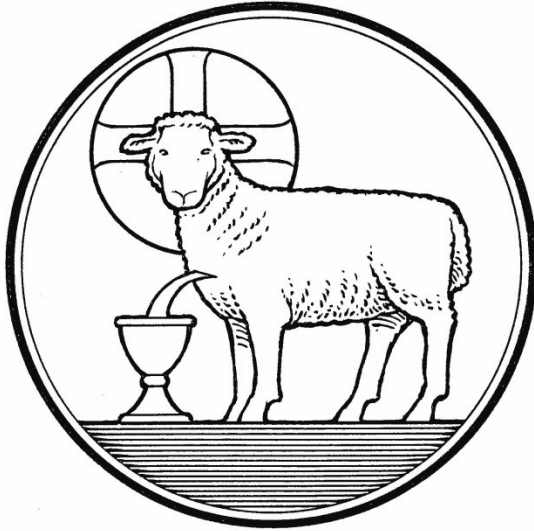

Welcome! With regard to Holy Communion, we ask our visitors to respect our practice of *closed Communion*, which means that only communicant members of our congregation or of other congregations in communion with us are invited to commune at the Lord's Table here, after they have been examined and absolved. Classes are offered throughout the year by the pastor so that those who are interested in joining our Communion fellowship have the opportunity to learn about the Christian faith and our confession of it.

- P** Dearly beloved: Since we intend to come to the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, we do well to examine ourselves carefully, as St. Paul urges us. For this holy Sacrament has been instituted for the

special comfort and strengthening of those who humbly confess their sins and hunger and thirst for righteousness.

But if we examine ourselves in this way, we will find nothing in us but sin and death, from which we can in no way set ourselves free. Therefore, our Lord Jesus Christ has had mercy on us and has taken upon Himself our nature, that He might fulfill for us the whole will and Law of God and, for us and for our deliverance, suffer death and all that we by our sins have deserved.

And to the end that we should the more confidently believe this and be strengthened by our faith in a cheerful obedience to His holy will, He has instituted the holy Sacrament of His Supper, in which He feeds us with His body and gives us to drink of His blood.

Therefore, whoever eats of this bread and drinks of this cup, firmly believing the words of Christ, dwells in Christ, and Christ in him, and has eternal life.

We should do this also in remembrance of Him, proclaiming His death, that He was delivered for our trespasses and raised again for our justification, and giving Him sincere thanks for the this, we should take up our cross and follow Him, and, according to His commandment, love one another even as He has loved us. For we are all one bread and one body, even as we are all partakers of this one bread and drink of this one cup.

Stripping of the Altar

HYMN

TLH #150 – Lord Jesus, Thou Art Going Forth

*The **Congregation** sings **stanzas 1,3 & 5** – the words of **The Soul**.*

The Pastor sings stanzas 2 & 4 – the words of Jesus.

During the hymn the Communion vessels are removed and the altar is solemnly stripped as a picture of the Lord's abandonment by His disciples on Maundy Thursday. The pastor exits the chancel, carrying the Paschal candle.

The congregation may depart as the post-service music begins to play.
