We celebrate the Divine Service (also known as the Mass) every Sunday and on other festivals, and we welcome visitors to hear God's Word with us.

The Order of Service is the Order of Vespers from *The Lutheran Hymnal* (TLH), with extra Scripture lessons and hymns for Christmas Eve. The entire service is printed in this service folder. You will only need a hymnal for the singing of the hymns.

Individual candles (both wax and battery-operated) are available in the back of the church. They will be lit as the last hymn, *Silent Night!*, is introduced. The ushers will walk down the center aisle to light the candle of the person nearest the aisle in each row. Please pass the flame to the candle of the person next to you. Those sitting near the candles in the window sills may light their candles from those flames instead. Those with battery-operated candles may turn them on at that time as well. Parents are asked to supervise their children's use of the candles carefully.
