Classes are offered throughout the year by the pastor so that those who are interested in becoming communicant members have the opportunity to learn about the Christian faith and our confession of it.



THE EXHORTATION

The Pastor exhorts the Congregation. All then stand.

THE EXAMINATION AND ABSOLUTION

- P And now I ask you before God, who searches the heart:
- 1. Do you confess from the heart that you have sinned against God and deserved His wrath and punishment? Then declare so by saying: I do confess.

Truly, you should confess; for Holy Scripture declares: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

2. Do you sincerely repent of all your sins committed in thought, word, and deed? Then declare so by saying: I do repent.

Truly, you should repent, as did the penitent sinners: King David, who prayed for a contrite heart; Peter, who wept bitterly; the sinful woman; the prodigal son; and others.

3. Do you sincerely believe that God, by grace, for Jesus' sake, will forgive you all your sins? Then declare so by saying: I do believe.

Truly, you should so believe, for Holy Scripture declares: "God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

4. Do you promise that with the aid of the Holy Spirit you will from now on amend your sinful life? Then declare so by saying: I do promise.

Truly, you should so promise, for Christ, the Lord, says: "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven."

5. Finally, do you believe that through me, a called servant of God, you will receive the forgiveness of all your sins? Then declare so by saying: I do believe.

As you believe, so may it be done for you.

Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Stripping of the Altar

HYMN TLH #150 – Lord Jesus, Thou Art Going Forth

The **Congregation** sings **stanzas 1,3 & 5** – the words of **The Soul**.

The Pastor sings stanzas 2 & 4 – the words of Jesus.

During the hymn the Communion vessels are removed and the altar is solemnly stripped as a picture of the Lord's abandonment by His disciples on Maundy Thursday. The pastor exits the chancel, carrying the Paschal candle.

The congregation may depart as the post-service music begins to play.
