Welcome! Emmanuel is an independent, liturgical, traditional, historical, evangelical, catholic, orthodox, confessional Lutheran congregation. We believe that the Bible is the very Word of God, inspired and without any errors. We confess the Christian faith according to the Lutheran Book of Concord of 1580 because we believe the confessions contained therein to be in accord with the teaching of Holy Scripture. We observe the calendar of the traditional Church Year and follow the Historic Lectionary. We celebrate the Divine Service (also known as the Mass) every Sunday and on other festivals, and we welcome visitors to hear God's Word with us.



The order of service for this evening is printed in this service folder. You will only need your hymnal for the hymns.

Individual candles (both wax and battery-operated) are available in the back of the church. They will be lit as the last hymn, *Silent Night!*, is introduced. An usher will walk down the center aisle to light the candle of the person nearest the aisle in each row. Please pass the flame to the candle of the person next to you. Those sitting near the candles in the window sills may light their candles from those flames instead. Those with battery-operated candles may turn them on at that time as well. Parents are asked to supervise their children's use of the candles carefully.






